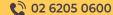

A reminder about illegal dumping in our local community

In the ACT it is an offence to dump or store rubbish in a public place, including on a nature strip.

Penalties of fines, and sometimes imprisonment, apply for anyone caught or identified illegally dumping rubbish in public spaces. You can report illegal dumping online through *Fix my Street* or phone Access Canberra on 13 22 81.

If you have unwanted waste to dispose of you can drop items off at ACT Government resource management centre in Mitchell or Mugga Lane. Fees may apply, however many items may be dropped off for free. Items in good working order may be donated to Goodies

Junction located at the Mitchell and Mugga Lane resource management centres.

Most ACT households are also eligible for one free bulky waste collection of up to 2 cubic metres per financial year. The bulky waste collection service is great for hard waste that is too big for your kerbside bins, such as old furniture and broken appliances. You can book a bulky waste collection online at

cityservices.act.gov.au/recycling-and-waste/ collection/bulky-waste-collection.
